

Data Protection: important information about staying in touch – Deadline 25th May 2018

Dear Partners and Friends,

With changes to the data protection laws coming into effect in May 2018, Calvary Christian Fellowship is required to update your existing permission to ensure you are still happy for us to keep your details.

In order to do so, we are required to clarify what we will do with your data and how long we might keep it. We look to comply with the law and take care of your personal details seriously and use the data, simply so we can keep in touch and update you regarding:

- (i) general news about CCF
- (ii) information about forthcoming events, activities and services
- (iii) opportunities to contribute to, or participate in, the ongoing work of the Church.
- (iv) organisation of rotas and other administrative tasks
- (v) financial and non-financial support such as prayer
- (vi) processing of donations and appropriate maintenance of our accounts and records (including the processing of gift aid applications)

We would like to keep in touch with you for the foreseeable future. Assuming you are happy to continue hearing from us, please complete the consent form to confirm the type(s) of information you would like to receive and how you would like to receive it, along with your present contact details.

It would be greatly advantageous to us, given that we don't feel that we overload our communication, for each box to be checked in order for us to have permission for communication for all three stated purposes via each of post, phone, text, email and social media. Of course, you are free to restrict contact, as stated on the consent form.
